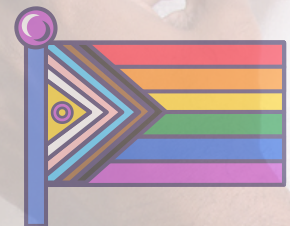

# Operational Excellence

## Exemplary Standing with Accreditation Canada!

Overseen by the Executive Director, Normandie Wragg, Maltby was accredited by Accreditation Canada with exemplary standing for both our mental health AND autism services.

This was our first time working to the Accreditation Canada standards, having previously worked to those of the Canadian Centre on Accreditation.

Attaining accreditation with Exemplary Standing from Accreditation Canada is important for our organization, our staff, and the community for several reasons.

1. Firstly, accreditation demonstrates that the organization is committed to delivering high-quality and safe services to our clients.
2. It also signifies that we have met or exceeded national standards for healthcare, which can increase trust and credibility with both staff and the community.
3. Additionally, accreditation can help with staff morale and satisfaction, as it shows that the organization values continuous improvement and excellence in care.
4. Ultimately, accreditation with Exemplary Standing can lead to improved outcomes for clients, staff, and the community as a whole.

**Achieving 100% of the 546 standards measured**, this was an outstanding achievement for Team Maltby. Special thanks to both Deb Hendy and Cailin Scott for leading this process.



# Numbers that Matter

## 2023-2024 FACTS AND FIGURES

### Same-day access to therapy

**299** children and youth accessed a same-day therapy appointment with a Registered Psychotherapist.

### Support at school

**80** students were supported in our school-based programs: Nexus, Belong, and ABC.

### Right service, right time

**66** children and youth accessed our Walk-In Clinic with mental health needs who would've otherwise gone to their doctor or the emergency department.

### Access across the region

**3124** staff hours spent travelling to clients and families to provide services where they need it.

### Help where clients need it

**1019** hours of in-home mental health services were provided to children, youth, and families with high-level needs.

### Successful transitions

**26** students with Autism were successfully supported in transitioning to their home classroom through our Connections program.

### Free support

**794** families received FREE help registering for OAP numbers, obtaining funding, and other free foundational services relating to an autism diagnosis.

### Involved caregivers

**91%**

of caregivers in mental health services reported feeling they were a valued member of the care team for their loved one.

**14** students successfully transitioned from Maltby Centre ECPP classrooms back to their home classroom.

### Professional service

**10,774** hours of counselling provided to children and youth by Registered Psychotherapists.

### Expanding services

**2721** hours of direct service provided to clients in Autism Fee for Service programs.

### Evidence-based programs

**96** clients enrolled in SNAP, an evidence-based, behavioural model teaching children and their parents effective emotional regulation and problem-solving skills.

### Coordinated service

**3772** mental health staff hours spent coordinating with other service providers to ensure the best care for clients.

### Access to mental health services

**3118** clients served through our therapy, intensive, targeted prevention, crisis, specialized, and family capacity building services.

### Access to autism services

**994** clients with autism who participated in foundational, behavioural, or school support services.



# Partnerships & Systems Integration

## **Youth Wellness Hubs Ontario (KFLA)**

Delivered by One Roof, in collaboration with Maltby, and other valuable community partners. The focus of the Youth Wellness Hubs KFLA team is to increase rural community outreach programs at various locations. Using the mobile RV unit from KCHC, referred to as “The Porch”, the service team has been able to roll into smaller communities to provide outreach for mental health, medical support via the nurse practitioner, including sexual health, and intake for Ontario Works and Ontario Disability Support Program.

## **Provincial Training Initiative**

Through CMHO (Children’s Mental Health Ontario) and LAC (Lead Agency Consortium), Maltby clinical staff are involved in a Provincial Training Initiative which began in January 2024. This offers a free opportunity for our registered psychotherapists and supervisors to access training, develop skills, and obtain supervision for two priority areas identified by our training network, which include the lead agencies of Maltby Centre and Children’s Mental Health Services – Hastings Prince Edward, and our Core Service Providers.

## **Kingston Health Sciences Centre (KHSC)**

Maltby’s triage staff has been working with KHSC to re-vamp the KFLA Centralized Triage form for all Children & Youth Mental Health requests. This will ensure that all medical professionals receive the same form and are provided with the same necessary information to offer intake appointments for youth in need or provide pathways to urgent services elsewhere.

**The Maltby Youth Advisory Committee (YAC)** kicked off with a bang on November 8, 2023, welcoming three fresh faces and a cool youth facilitator who's a YAC veteran of two years. The YAC gang is on fire, juggling social media projects, organizing a food drive for rural folks, and crafting a fun video showcasing the journey to their office (starting from the bus ride to their spot). Let the good times roll!

**The Maltby Family Advisory Committee (FAC)** is like the Avengers of parents who have superheroes-in-training benefiting from Maltby's mental health and autism services. They swoop in, capes fluttering, to make sure all the important stuff gets superhero-level attention. Their time and effort are like gold to us - we tip our hats to these mighty guardians!



# Partnerships & Systems Integration

**The KFL&A Family Advisory Committee (FAC)** is the superhero squad championing for families and kids in the KFL&A region. Not only have they whipped up a nifty "Guide to Navigating Your Child's Mental Health Services in KFL&A," they're also on a mission to shake up the provincial government to pump more funds into mental health services. These folks are the real deal!

## **Lead Agency Consortium**

Maltby, as the Lead Agency for children and young people's mental health in the area, is the regional representative at the Lead Agency Consortium. Lead Agencies were appointed by the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care as part of the Roadmap to Wellness and are tasked with moving this system-building work forward for children, youth and families.

## **RESEARCH**

### **The Complex Patient Project: Stepped Services for Children & Youth with Complex Mental Health Needs**

Maltby Centre, together with community partners in KFL&A and surrounding regions, completed a project funded by the Ontario Trillium Foundation – Resilient Communities Fund. The purpose of this project was to evaluate the need for Stepped Services, specifically the need for live-in treatment within the region. The project also evaluated the mental health system as a whole to identify existing gaps and support the development of specific recommendations.

#### **Recommendations:**

Key recommendations shared in August 2023 include (1) the urgent need for local live in treatment program(s) in the KFL&A region that will provide step up care from community services and step down care from the hospital, (2) the development and implementation of a stepped care model in KFL&A and (3) building the steps of the care model through programs and services geared to intensive services for clients with complex mental health needs.

Specific recommendations include improving coordinated care and increasing service access, as well as expanded crisis and respite services.



# Partnerships & Systems Integration

## **Maltby Centre Research Publication**

We announced the publication of a clinical research project that our agency research team had been working on over the last few years. The team has attempted to therapeutically address emotional regulation through a novel counselling approach to youth on the autism spectrum. The goal was to develop an 8-session model that would be effective in regulating mood.

The model our agency research team developed was published in the September issue of the peer-reviewed journal, Australian and New Zealand Journal of Family Therapy. The title of the manuscript is **A novel psychotherapy for low-needs youth on the autism spectrum with emotional regulation challenges.**

The research collaboration included agency staff and other community/academic members (Everett McGuinty/Maltby Centre, Alain Carlson/Nipissing University, John Nelson/One Kids Place, & Cailin Scott/Maltby Centre).

## **Roadmap to Wellness Task Force**

The Roadmap to Wellness Task Force (the Task Force) is made up of over 35 agencies with a stake in child and youth mental health in KFL&A, including members from our Family and Youth Advisory Committees. Maltby Centre leads the Task Force and organizes quarterly meetings.

In January 2024, the Task Force submitted our Service Area Plan to the Ministry of Health, highlighting priority areas in core mental health services as well as community mental health priorities. These priorities were developed in consultation with a broad range of stakeholders, including staff, union representatives, core service providers, Task Force members, Indigenous service partners, families, and youth.

The Task Force will continue to work toward these priority areas in the 2024-25 fiscal year.



# Partnerships & Systems Integration

## Community Mental Health Plan

As a Lead Agency through Roadmap to Wellness, Maltby Centre was responsible for submitting a multi-year Community Mental Health Plan identifying core service priorities and community priorities for Children and Youth Mental Health (CYMH).

A consultation plan involving feedback from Youth Diversion (Maltby's core service provider), the Roadmap to Wellness Task Force, the Child and Youth Services Planning Committee, Maltby Centre's union and staff, Youth Diversion staff, and the Youth and Family Advisory Committees, was submitted on January 12, 2024, and will guide Maltby's core service work internally, as well as that of the Roadmap to Wellness Task Force.

## The CARIBOU Pathway by CAMH

Maltby has been collaborating with CAMH and participating in the CARIBOU research project for the past few years.

Things are starting to get exciting as we plan for a winter 2025 launch of the CARIBOU2 treatment pathway for depression at Maltby. Part of this pathway will involve us working with Dr. Khan, who will be our consulting psychiatrist for the clients in the study!

The CARIBOU Pathway provides an evidence-based approach to treating depression in youth and uses a measurement-based care framework for assessing and monitoring their progress. As an integrated care pathway (ICP) for outpatient youth ages 13-18 (with potential for use up to age 24) with depression, a structured treatment plan for the youth maps the treatment process from start to finish.

The treatment is also collaborative, so youth are involved in decision-making, as are other people who support them, such as family members and their care team.



# IIDEA

## Indigenization, Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, Accessibility

### **2SLGBTQIA+**

Maltby has been busy shaking things up in the past year with the introduction of AFFIRM CBT-based group for 2SLGBTQIA+ youngsters! The autumn season saw a fantastic in-person group for the 12-14 crew, which was a hit. And guess what? A virtual group for the older gang is in the works!

But wait, there's more! Training sessions are already in full swing for a similar group using the AFFIRM model, but this time it's for the awesome parents and caregivers of our 2SLGBTQ+ clients. Fingers crossed, we're aiming to kick off this group in the coming fiscal year, as long as our staff superheroes are up for the challenge. Let the rainbow adventures begin!

### **FLS Services and Activities**

The provision of bilingual services continues to be an area of focus for Maltby. There are now French-speaking mental health therapists, autism therapists, intensive workers, managers, executive assistants, and program administrators.

Our FLS therapist met with MPP Ted Hsu in June 2023 to discuss French language services in Kingston and how to build on what exists. She also represented Maltby at the opening of the new French Cultural Centre on September 24, 2023, and at the Franco Foire on October 21, 2023, with one of our managers, Deb Hendy.

On January 25th, 2024, Maltby was present at a concentration table for agencies in Kingston that provide FLS services. On Feb 24th, 2024, the Maltby FLS therapist presented at the official Black History Month Celebration Ceremony organized by the Réseau de Soutien à l'Immigration Francophone de l'Est de l'Ontario in collaboration with the Public Service Alliance of Canada and the Department of Defence Visible Minority Advisory Group.

Maltby facilitates a quarterly French language partnership committee and attends local tables along with our FLS partners.



# IIDEA

## **Indigenous Senior Mental Health Therapist**

In August 2023, an Indigenous Senior Mental Health Therapist started at Maltby.

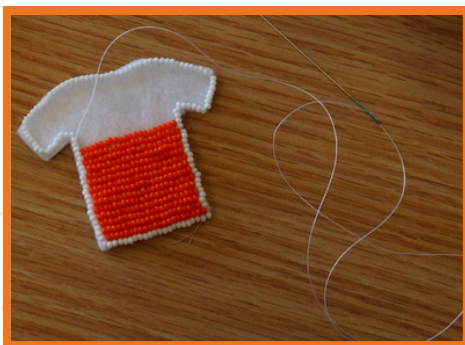
Over the last year, the Indigenous Senior Mental Health Therapist has been working on building community relationships with Indigenous partners and community members in the surrounding areas. In doing so, they have been mapping available resources for youth accessing Maltby services and where/to whom they may be referred for additional support.

They have connected with community Elders and Knowledge Keepers, the Indigenous Wellness Council, the Metis Nation of Ontario, Indigenous workers and others within the Limestone District School Board, IIPCT (Indigenous Interprofessional Primary Care Team), and One Roof.

**Our sincere thank you to the Grandmothers of the Indigenous Wellness Council for providing counsel on the development of the role description and for their ongoing support and guidance. Their efforts in this space will continue to leave a legacy for generations.**

## **Truth & Reconciliation “Week”**

In recognition of September 30, 2023's Truth and Reconciliation Day, Maltby planned a week of awareness, sharing of knowledge, activities and reflection. Events in the community were highlighted, a film was screened, and an education session took place around acknowledging events which recognize the Indigenous experience.



The “orange shirt” beading workshop for staff in honour of Truth & Reconciliation Day was so successful that a “red dress” beading workshop was scheduled for December 8, 2023, in honour of missing and murdered Indigenous women. The response was excellent and Maltby looks forward to continuing Indigenous craft workshops in 2024/25. Thank you to Metis Nation of Ontario for sharing their skills with us.

The all-staff learning event where the film was screened, shared the powerful stories and voices of Indigenous individuals who have lived through the experience of residential schools. The intention behind this presentation was to deepen our understanding and support for Truth and Reconciliation efforts.



# System Shift and Increasing Costs

Maltby Centre, experienced a significant system shift in provincial funding for the autism programs.

The funding for legacy autism programs concluded on September 30, 2023, marking the culmination of the provincial transition to a needs-based, fee-for-service model in autism. This funding shift and reduced revenue impacted our budget for 2024-2025.

Compounding this system shift, we anticipated an increase to our costs in 2024-2025 which exceed our provincial funding allocations and revenue. Our Board was fully engaged throughout this process, and close consultation with OPSEU/SEFPO Local 460 has taken place to address the budgetary impacts.

Maltby Centre was faced with tough decisions to manage our costs effectively. To ensure sustainability of our services, cost reductions were necessary across both clinical and administrative staff.

We continue to have approximately 100 qualified and dedicated staff across our mental health and autism services and our 2024/2025 budget is balanced.
